UNDERGRADUATE APPLICATION FOR READMISSION

Students interested in readmitting to Webster University are subject to the policies and procedures described in the current undergraduate catalog.

General Education

All students (except those entering the School of Communications) are required to complete twenty-seven (27) credit hours of general education with courses selected from nine (9) categories.* The nine general education categories are:

Critical Thinking	Communications	Historical	Consciousness
Humanities	Values	Cultural	Understanding
Arts Appreciation	Scientific Understanding	Mathematics	

*Professional degree programs (BSN, BBA, BFA, BM, BMed, and some BS degrees) require students to complete at least four of the nine general education categories.

School of Communications majors are required to complete 36 credits of general education distributed in three categories:

Category One: 18 credit hours (English, history, foreign language, general studies, religion, philosophy, art, dance, theater, music) English composition courses do not count.

Category Two: 12 credit hours (Political science, sociology, psychology, anthropology, women's studies, multicultural studies, international relations, international studies, economics)

Category Three: 6 credit hours (Computer Science, computer applications, mathematics, natural science, physical science)

General education requirements will be explained in further detail during an appointment with an academic advisor once you have been accepted for readmission and are ready to register.

Residency Requirement

Students are required to complete 30 of their last 36 credit hours directly from Webster University. Departmental residency requirements for the particular major must also be met.

Probationary Readmission

Students who left the University on academic probation and who are accepted for readmission will be readmitted on academic probation. Failure to earn a 2.0 GPA in the returning semester will result in dismissal.

Students who were academically dismissed from the University must have completed at least 12 transferable credit hours from another college or university and must have been away from Webster University for at least one year. Dismissed students, if accepted for readmission, may be readmitted on academic probation. Dismissed students who are readmitted on academic probation and who fail to earn a 2.0 GPA in their first semester upon return to the University are dismissed with no opportunity for appeal.

Business Office Holds

Students who have holds on their accounts from the Business Office will not be accepted for readmission or be able to register until all financial problems have been resolved. Students with pre-payment holds will be required to pay their full tuition at the time of registration.

Disciplinary Sanctions Holds

Students who have holds on their registration due to disciplinary sanctions must complete those sanctions and have the hold removed by the Associate Dean of Student Affairs before they will be considered for readmission or allowed to register.
